

ELECTORAL DIVISION PROFILES: AN INTRODUCTION

These profiles have been produced to support elected members, constituents and other interested parties in understanding the demographic, economic, social and educational profile of their neighbourhoods. We have used the latest data available at the time of publication.

Much more data is available from national and local sources than is captured here, but it is hoped that the profile will be a useful starting point for discussion, where local knowledge and experience can be used to flesh out and illuminate the information presented here.

The profile can be used to help look at some fundamental questions e.g.

- Does the age profile of the population match or differ from the national profile?
- Is there evidence of the ageing profile of the county in all the wards in the Division or just some?
- How diverse is the community in terms of ethnicity?
- What is the impact of deprivation on families and residents?
- Does there seem to be a link between deprivation and school performance?
- What is the breakdown of employment sectors in the area?
- Is it a relatively healthy area compared to the rest of the district or county?
- What sort of crime is prevalent in the community?

Data is presented around the key themes of education and skills, economy and employment, health and care, population, deprivation, housing, environment, transport and travel and crime. All areas of the county are covered, right down to district, ward and parish level, with information easily accessible in a variety of formats. You can also build your own reports by different themes and topics.


Technical Notes:

DEMOGRAPHIC PROFILE - AGE


In mid-2015, the population of Felixstowe North and Trimley stood at 9,873, a decrease of 0.3% since the 2011 Census. The age structure of the division is set out below. *This ward is not entirely within the division boundary, hence the figures do not sum.

- The age pyramid for Felixstowe North and Trimley shows a higher than average proportion of people over the age of 45
- The commonest age group in Felixstowe North and Trimley is 50-54 year olds, followed by 65 -69 year olds
- There is a much lower than average number of people of the younger age groups, particularly 20-39 year olds and under 5s

ETHNICITY




- According to the latest data (2011 Census), 97.5% (9,653) of the population of Felixstowe North and Trimley are white, with 95% white British
- There are 252 (2.5%) people of black or minority ethnic origin in the division
- Felixstowe North and Trimley has generally lower proportions of minority ethnic groups than Suffolk as a whole, Suffolk Coastal district and England and Wales

ECONOMY


There are 2,300 people employed in Felixstowe North and Trimley.



- Transport and storage is the most important industry by some margin in the division in terms of employment, with around one third of workers in the division employed in this sector, which includes haulage activity related to the Port of Felixstowe. The sector provides over 40% of jobs in the division
- Such is the dominance of transport and storage employment in the division that most other sectors have below average proportions of employment, but education also stands out as being an important employment sector, accounting for one in 5 jobs in the division

LABOUR MARKET

JOB SEEKERS ALLOWANCE CLAIMANT RATE



- Felixstowe North and Trimley has seen a decline in the Job Seekers Allowance claimants rate over the past three years with slight fluctuations in recent months
- The JSA claimant rate in the division is generally slightly higher than the district average but below the Suffolk and national level
- In early 2017, 0.5% of the working age population (aged 16-64) were claiming JSA



% pupils achieving Good Level of Development (GLD)




- Foundation stage attainment at schools in Felixstowe North and Trimley has seen general improvements over the past three years, following the county and national trend
- Trimley St Martin and Trimley St Mary Primary Schools have both seen improving foundation stage attainment in the period 2014 to 2016, with the latest figures showing attainment above the Suffolk and national average
- Attainment at Fairfield and Maidstone Infant Schools has fluctuated, with strong results in 2015 followed by below average attainment in 2016

Key Stage 2 (age 11)

Pupil Achievement in all three subjects, Reading, Writing and Mathematics
(2014–2015 as % Level 4 or better & 2016 % Expected Level or better).

In July 2016, there was a change in the way pupil achievement is measured at the end of KS2. Prior to 2016, pupils received National Curriculum Level grades for English and Maths, with L4 being the expected level at the end of Key Stage 2. In 2016 the measure scaled score and shows whether or not a pupil has achieved the national standard for that subject




- Key Stage 2 attainment at Causton Junior School has been below the county and national averages from 2014 to 2016
- Trimley St Martin and Trimley St Mary Primary Schools saw above average attainment levels in both 2014 and 2015, but results in 2016 using the new measure described above has seen below average attainment at the schools

GCSE (Key Stage 4) (age 16)

In July 2016, an additional measure of pupil achievement at Key Stage 4 was introduced but for the purposes of this profile and to demonstrate change over time, we have presented consistent data for the period 2014-2016 using the % pupils achieving five or more GCSEs (or equivalent) at A*-C including English and Mathematics




- GCSE attainment results Felixstowe Academy have been below county and national averages from 2014 to 2016, although 2016 saw a significant improvement according to the latest data
- Attainment at the school remains adrift of the county and national averages

A Level (Key Stage 5) (age 18)


Average point score per student

In 2016 there was a change in the way pupil achievement is measured at the end of KS5 and so the trend over time should not therefore be considered. The relative level of attainment at schools in the Electoral Division versus the Suffolk and National averages can still be seen.



- A Level attainment results at Felixstowe Academy have been consistently below average from 2014 to 2016
- There was an improvement in attainment in 2015 but progress against the national average has been limited and is hard to determine given the changes in methodology in 2016

NEET % (NOT IN EDUCATION, EMPLOYMENT OR TRAINING)




- In January 2017, 3.8% of 16-18 year olds in Felixstowe North and Trimley were classified as NEET (where current activity is known)
- The NEET level in Felixstowe North and Trimley is currently below both the Suffolk average and Suffolk Coastal rate. NEET figures in the division have fallen considerably over the last few months and have been generally higher than the district level


INDEX OF MULTIPLE DEPRIVATION (IMD) 2015 (SEE MAP OVERLEAF)

The IMD combines a number of indicators, chosen to cover a range of economic, social and housing issues, into a single deprivation score for each small area in England. This allows each area to be ranked relative to one another according to their level of deprivation. Small areas (Lower Super Output Areas, average population 1,500) are most usually described as being in 1 of 5 quintile bands. The bottom quintile represents the 20% of areas that are the most deprived in the country; these are shaded red on the map. The top quintile represents the least deprived areas in the country, and is shaded green.

The Index is widely used to analyse patterns of deprivation, identify areas that would benefit from special initiatives or programmes and as a tool to determine eligibility for specific funding streams.




- The IMD 2015 shows that relative deprivation levels in Felixstowe North and Trimley are varied, with the division split across four of the five deprivation quintiles
- Of the seven Lower Layer Super Output Areas (LSOA) comprising the division, two are ranked in the top 20% least deprived LSOAs in the country, one is in the next best quintile, two are in the mid quintile and two are in the second most deprived quintile



HEALTH


The local data used here is based on relatively small numbers of deaths. The confidence limits provide an indication of the reliability of the data. The 95% confidence intervals utilised on the chart provide a range within which there is 95% chance of the true result lying.

LIFE EXPECTANCY AT BIRTH




- Life expectancy estimates in Felixstowe North and Trimley are relatively high, with, on average, both males and females in the division living longer than in Suffolk or the UK as a whole
- For women in the division, life expectancy is 84.4 years, around two years longer than the national average
- Life expectancy for men in Felixstowe North and Trimley is 80.4 years, again, more than one year longer than the national level

DEATHS, UNDER 75 YEARS, STANDARDISED MORTALITY RATIO



- The estimated rate of deaths for all causes in Felixstowe North and Trimley is high compared to the district, and county level
- The standardised mortality ratio data shown here means that for every 100 early deaths from all causes across the UK as a whole, there are an estimated 94 comparable deaths in Felixstowe North and Trimley

CRIME & COMMUNITY SAFETY



- Crime levels in Felixstowe North and Trimley are low. Around 41 crimes per 1,000 residents were recorded in the division in 2015, compared to 38 in Suffolk Coastal and 59 countywide
- Criminal damage and other theft are the two most commonly committed crimes in the division
- There is a significant proportion of violent crime in the division, higher than the district average, but lower than for the county overall
