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# ELECTORAL DIVISION PROFILES: AN INTRODUCTION

These profiles have been produced to support elected members, constituents and other interested parties in understanding the demographic, economic, social and educational profile of their neighbourhoods. We have used the latest data available at the time of publication.

Much more data is available from national and local sources than is captured here, but it is hoped that the profile will be a useful starting point for discussion, where local knowledge and experience can be used to flesh out and illuminate the information presented here.

The profile can be used to help look at some fundamental questions e.g.

- Does the age profile of the population match or differ from the national profile?
- Is there evidence of the ageing profile of the county in all the wards in the Division or just some?
- How diverse is the community in terms of ethnicity?
- What is the impact of deprivation on families and residents?
- Does there seem to be a link between deprivation and school performance?
- What is the breakdown of employment sectors in the area?
- Is it a relatively healthy area compared to the rest of the district or county?
- What sort of crime is prevalent in the community?

Data is presented around the key themes of population, children and young people, health and social care, housing, crime and community safety, deprivation, economy and employment and environment. All areas of the county are covered, right down to district, electoral division, ward and parish level, with information easily accessible in a variety of formats. You can also build your own reports for custom areas.

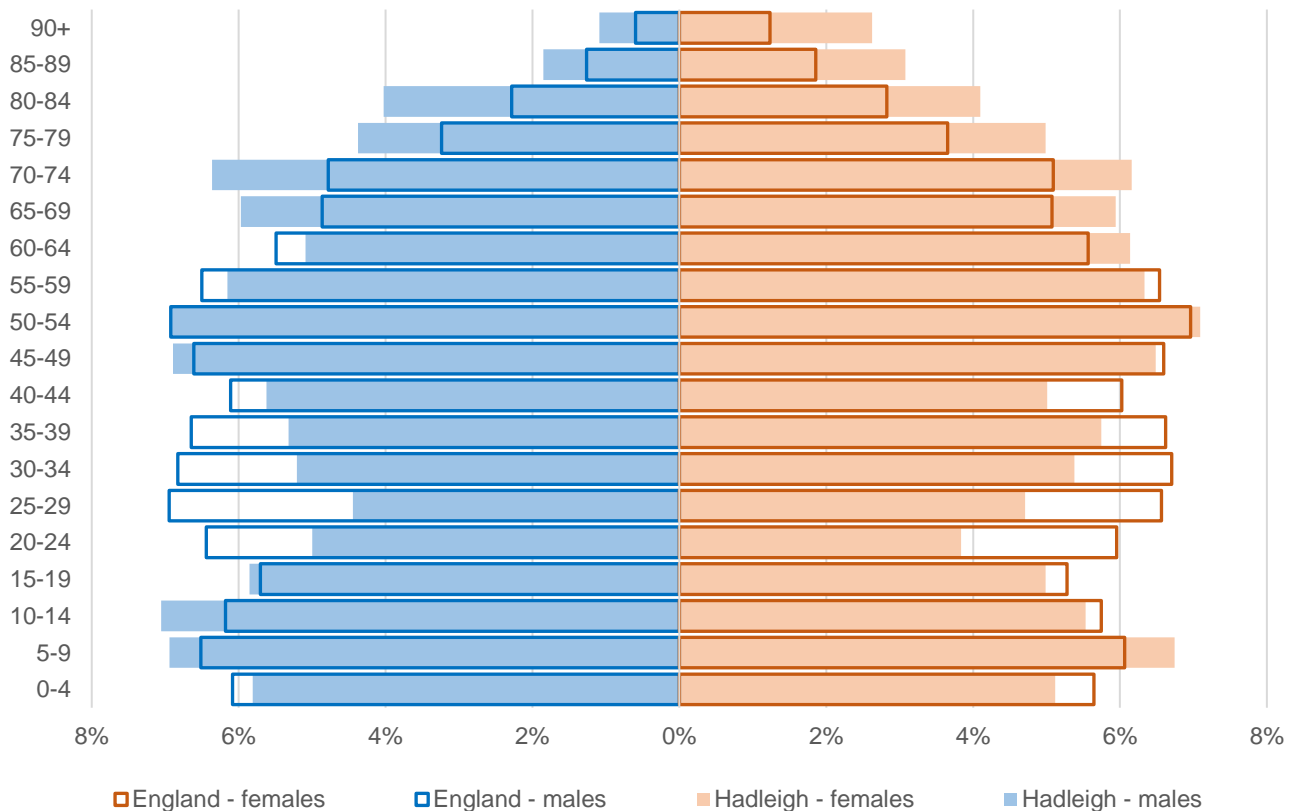
## **Technical Notes:**

1. Where electoral divisions do not exactly match the boundaries at which the data is available (e.g. ward, Output Area or Lower Super Output Area), we have adopted a "best-fit" approach to produce a dataset.
2. District, county and national level data is provided where possible to provide a context for comparisons. Where possible we have used the most recent district boundaries for comparison purposes, but in some cases it has been necessary to use the pre-2019 districts.

## DEMOGRAPHIC PROFILE - AGE

In mid-2019 the population of Hadleigh stood at 8,933, an increase of 8.2% since the 2011 Census. The age structure of the component wards and the division as a whole is set out below.

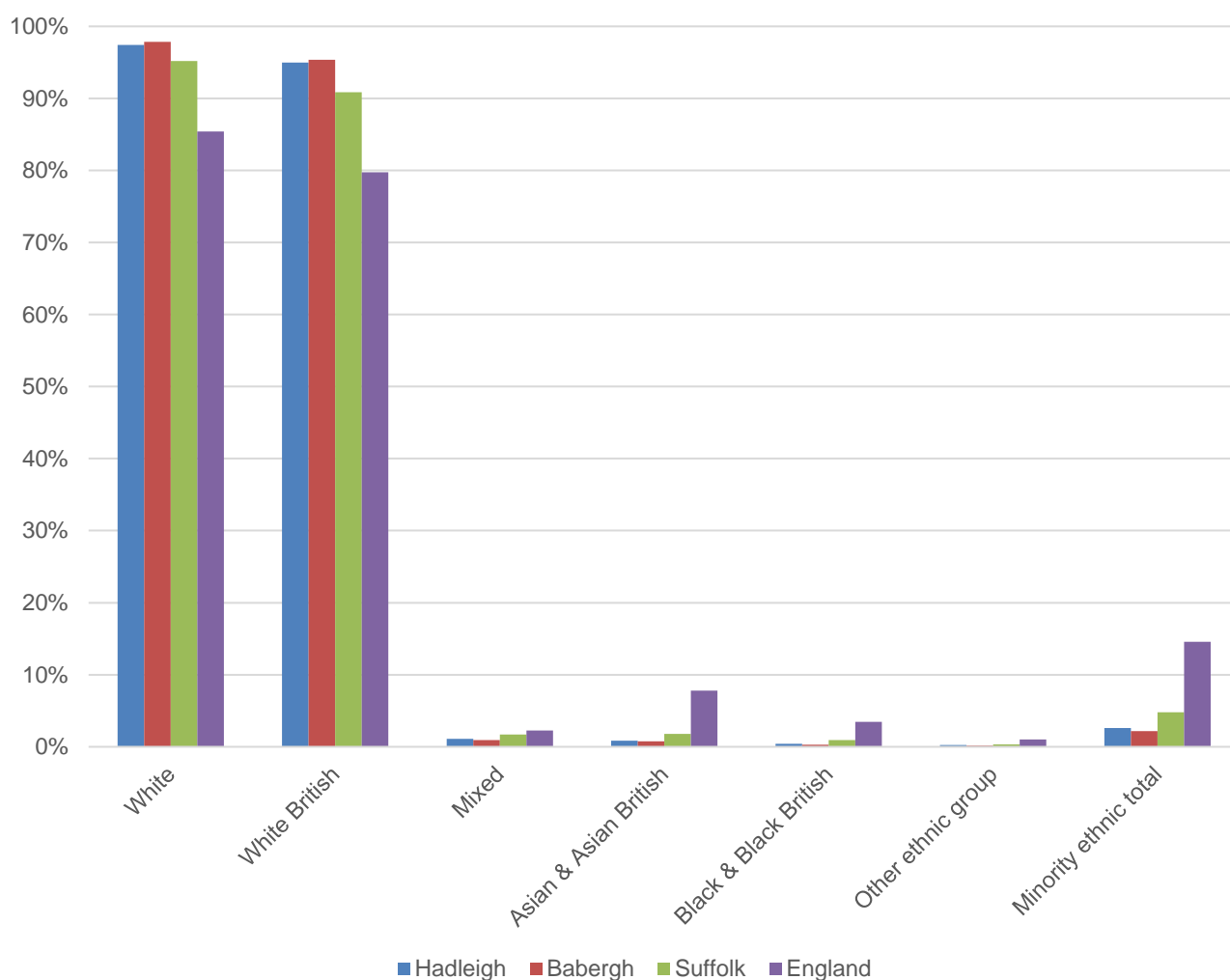

- The age pyramid for Hadleigh shows a higher-than-average proportion of people in every age band over 65.
- The most common age group in Hadleigh is 50–54-year-olds, followed by 5-9-year-olds.

- There is a much lower than average number of people of working age, particularly 20-39-year-olds

## ETHNICITY



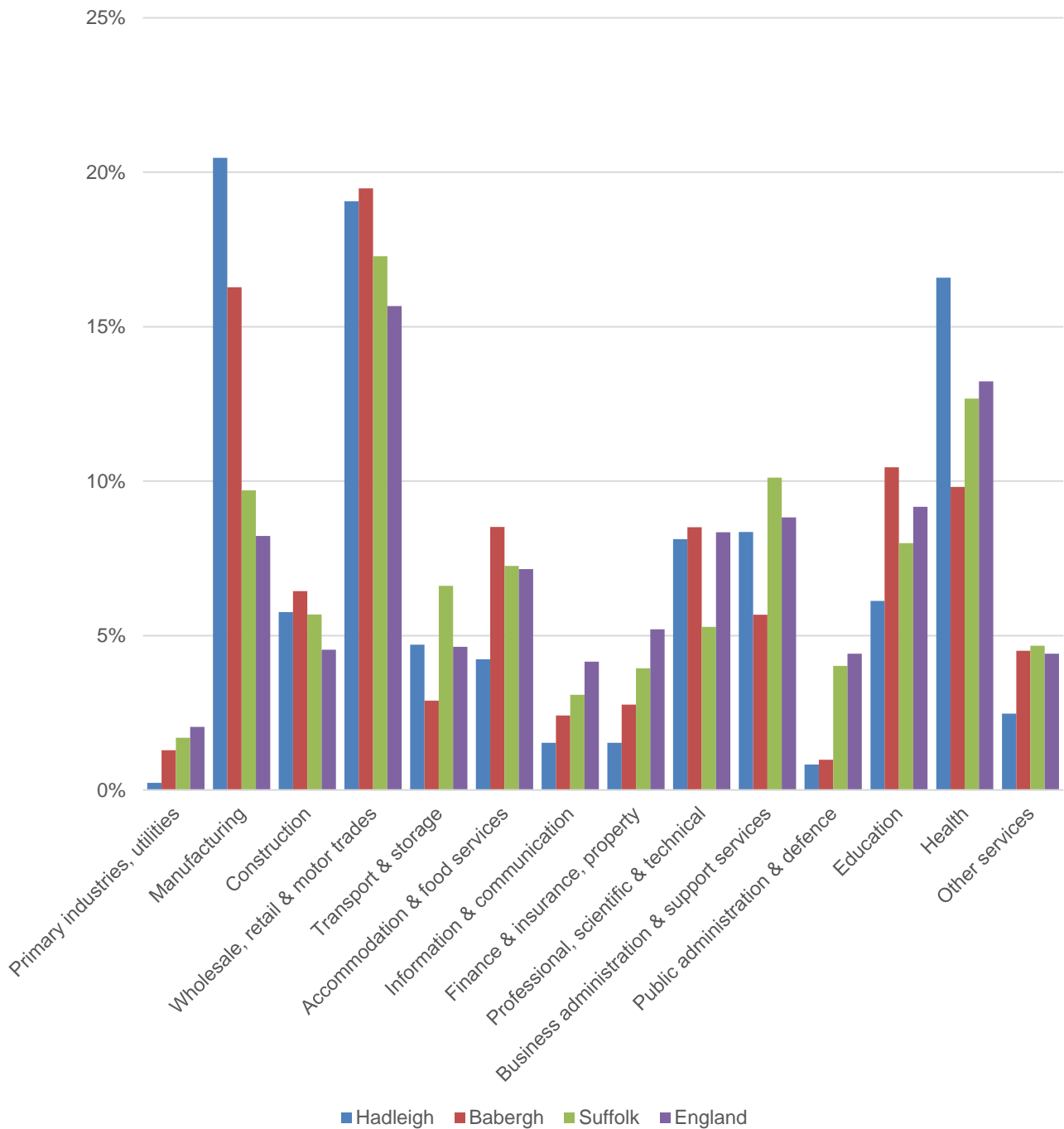
- According to the latest data (2011 Census), 97.4% of the population of Hadleigh are white, which is slightly above the Suffolk average.
- Hadleigh has a similar diversity profile to Babergh district, and generally lower proportions of minority ethnic groups than Suffolk as a whole.

# ECONOMY

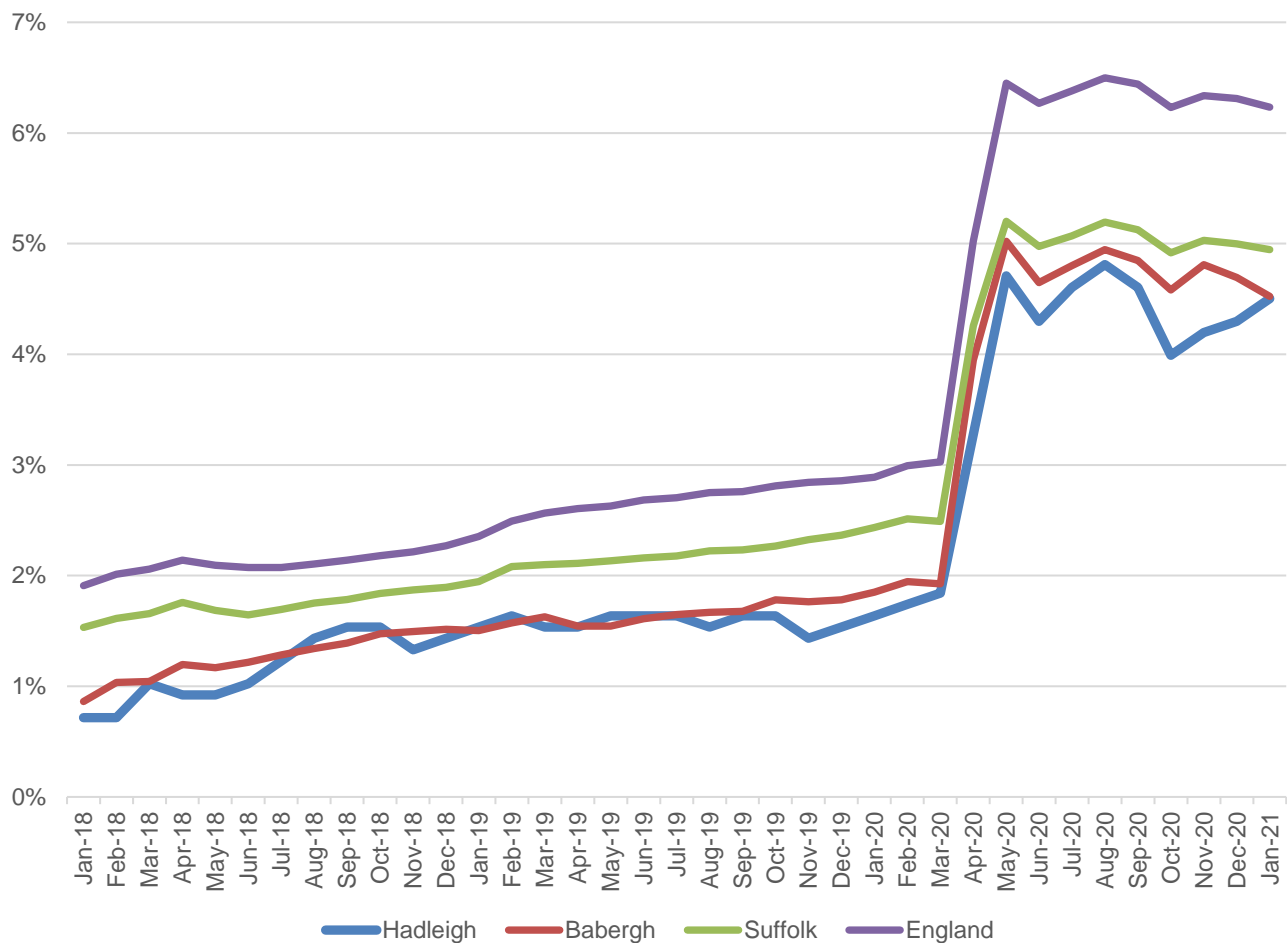
There are 4,300 people employed in Hadleigh.



- The key employment sectors in Hadleigh are manufacturing, wholesale, retail and motor trades and health.
- Over half of jobs in Hadleigh are provided by these three sectors.
- Construction, professional, scientific and technical services, business administration and support services and education also each account for more than 5% of jobs in the division.

# LABOUR MARKET

## OUT-OF-WORK BENEFIT CLAIMANT RATE



- Hadleigh saw a sharp increase in claimants of out-of-work benefits in the first half of 2020 as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Hadleigh has a very similar claimant unemployment rate to Babergh as a whole, but well below the national average.
- In January 2021, around 4.5% of the working age population (aged 16-64) are claiming out-of-work benefits in Hadleigh, half a percentage point below the Suffolk average.

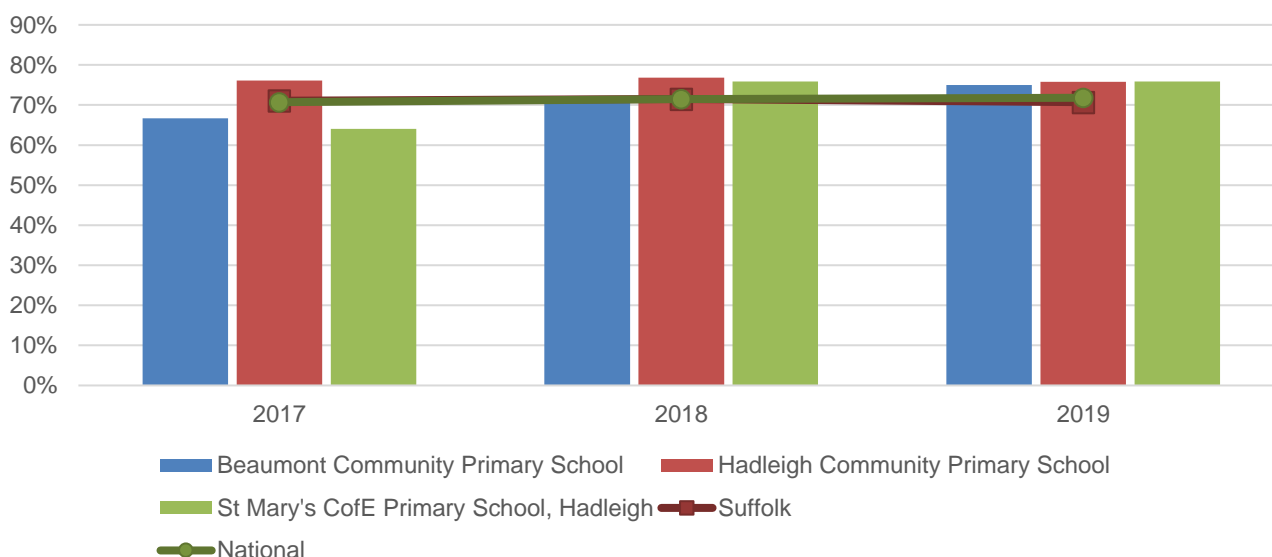

% pupils achieving Good Level of Development (GLD)

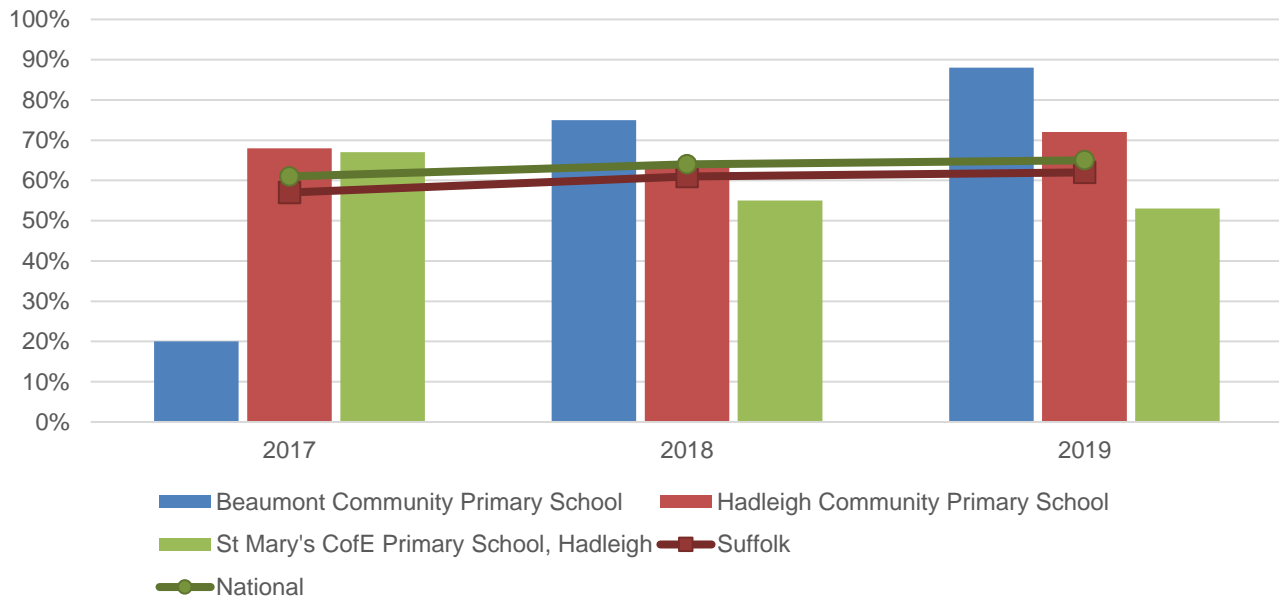


- Foundation Stage attainment at Hadleigh Community Primary School has been consistently above the Suffolk and national averages from 2017 to 2019.
- Attainment at Beaumont CP School has increased steadily during this period and was above the county and national average in 2019.

- At St Mary's Church of England Primary School, attainment was also above average in 2018 and 2019 after lower performance in 2017.

### Key Stage 2 (age 11)

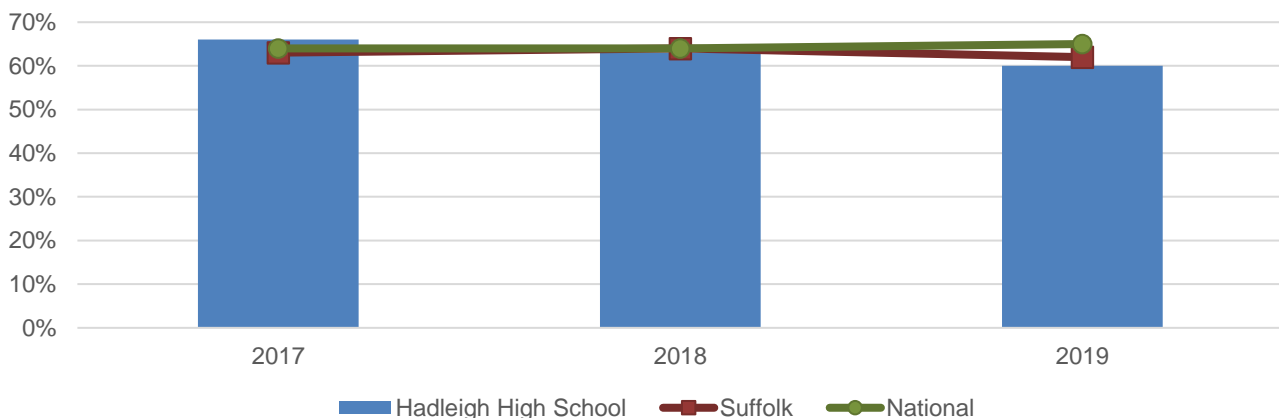
% pupils achieving the Expected Level or better in Reading, Writing and Mathematics



- Key Stage 2 attainment at Hadleigh Community Primary School has been consistently at or above the national average during the last three years of available data.
- KS2 attainment at Beaumont CP School has increased dramatically during this period and was the strongest performing school in the division in 2019, with 88% of pupils achieving the expected level or better in reading, writing and mathematics.
- St Mary's Church of England primary school has seen declining performance from 2017 to 2019, with below average attainment in the latter two years.

### Key Stage 4 (GCSE) (age 16)

- GCSE attainment at Hadleigh High school is generally high, but has declined steadily from 2017 to 2019, dipping below the county and national average in the most recent year.

## NEET % (NOT IN EDUCATION, EMPLOYMENT OR TRAINING)

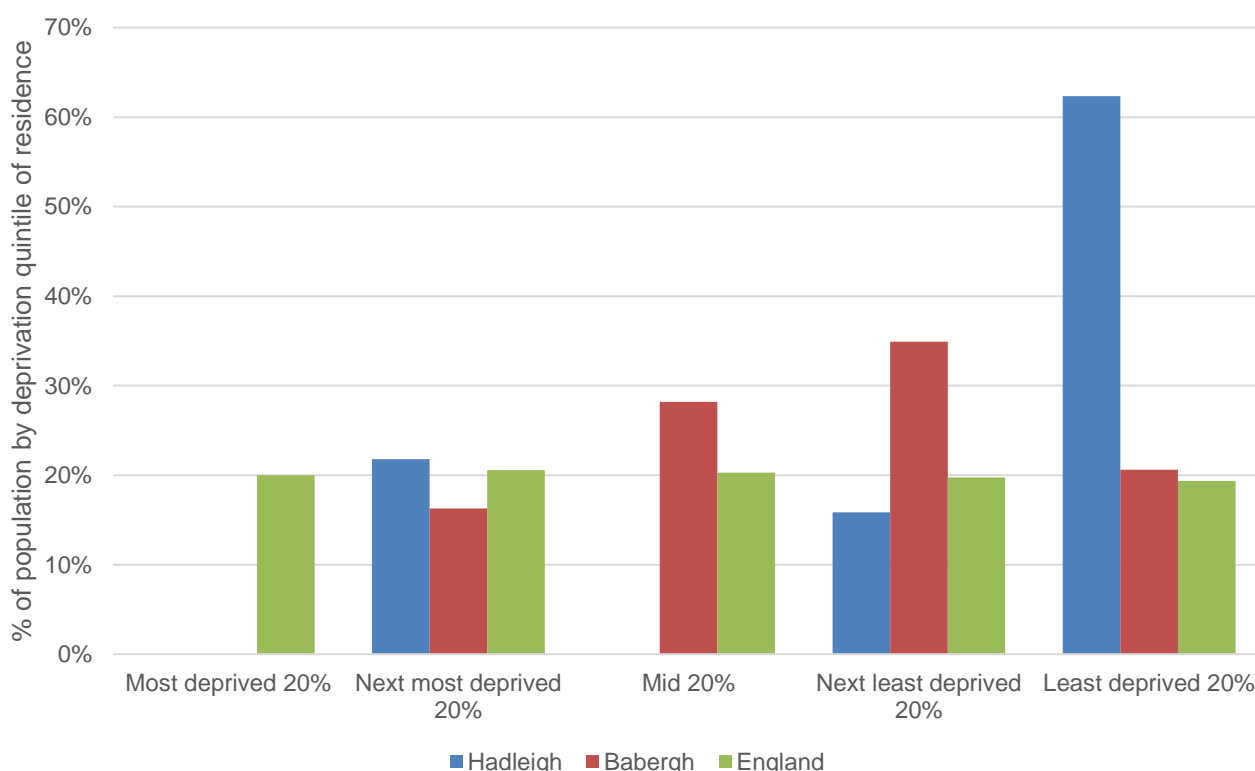


- In January 2021, 2.8% of the 16-18-year-olds in Hadleigh were classified as NEET (where current activity is known).
- NEET levels in Hadleigh tend to be below the Suffolk average and similar to the Babergh average.

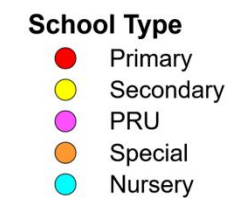
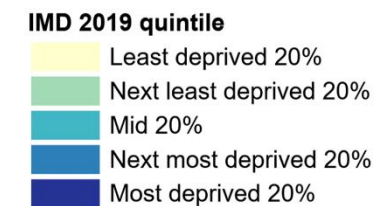
## INDEX OF MULTIPLE DEPRIVATION (IMD) 2019 (SEE MAP OVERLEAF)

The IMD combines a number of indicators, chosen to cover a range of economic, social and housing issues, into a single deprivation score for each small area in England. This allows each area to be ranked relative to one another according to their level of deprivation. Small areas (Lower Super Output Areas, average population 1,700) are most commonly described as being in 1 of 5 quintile bands. The bottom quintile represents the 20% of areas that are the most deprived in England; these are shaded pale yellow on the map. The top quintile represents the least deprived areas in England and is shaded dark blue.

The Index is widely used to analyse patterns of deprivation, identify areas that would benefit from special initiatives or programmes and as a tool to determine eligibility for specific funding streams.



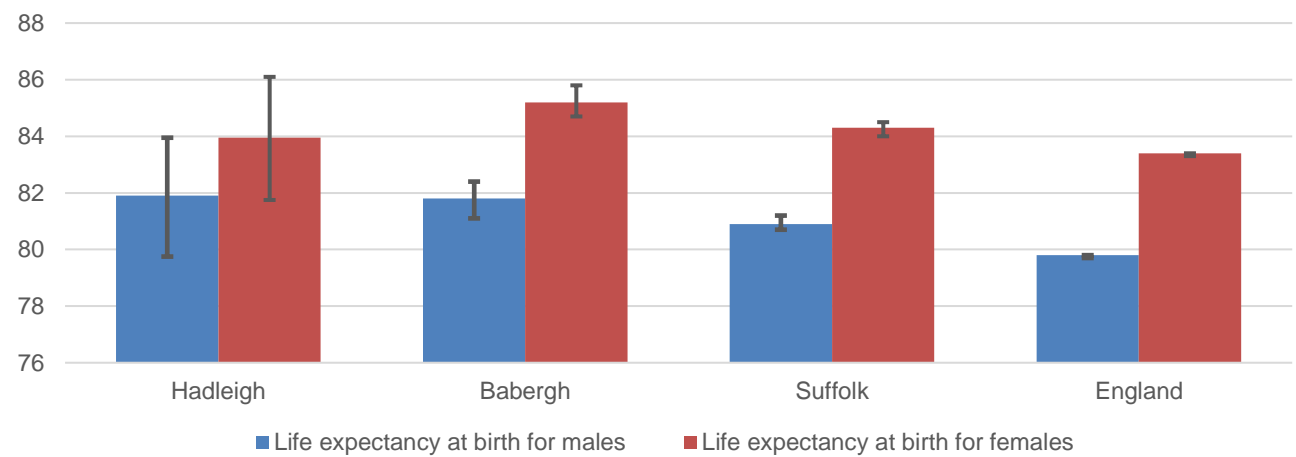
- The IMD 2019 shows that relative deprivation levels in Hadleigh are relatively low, with the majority of the division among the least deprived 20% nationally, but there are areas of higher relative deprivation in the division.
- Of the five Lower Layer Super Output Areas (LSOAs) comprising the division, three are ranked in the top 20% least deprived LSOAs in the country (accounting for just over 60% of Hadleigh's population), one is in the next least deprived quintile and one is in the second most deprived quintile.



# HEALTH

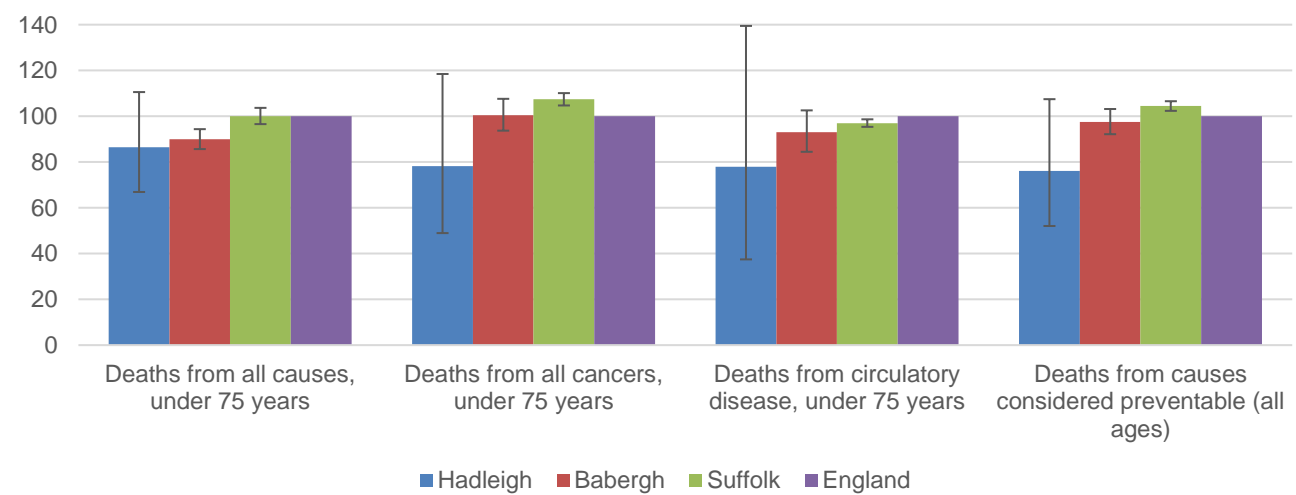
The local data used here is based on relatively small numbers. The confidence limits provide an indication of the reliability of the data. The 95% confidence intervals utilised on the chart provide a range within which there is 95% chance of the true result lying.

## LIFE EXPECTANCY AT BIRTH



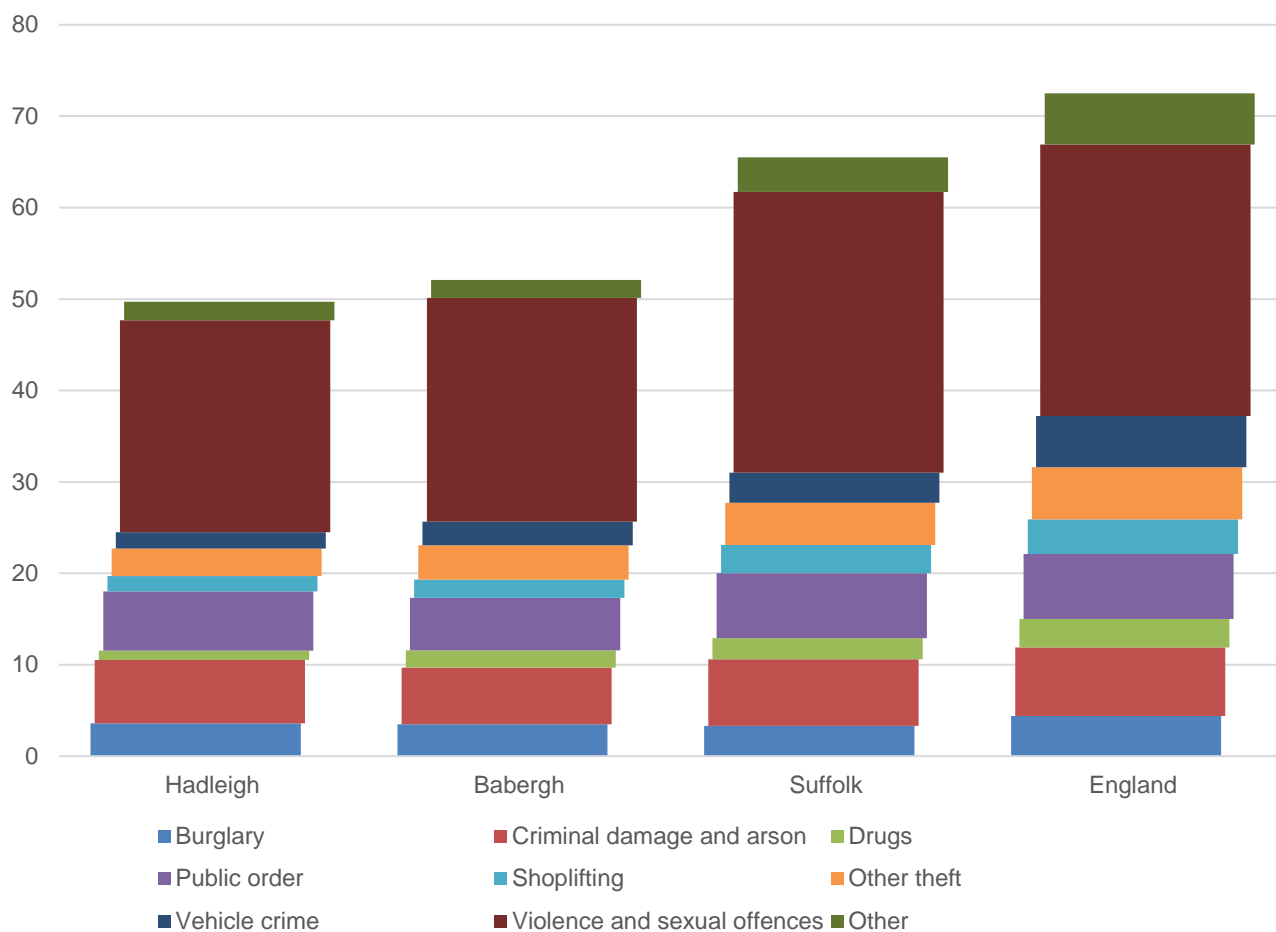
- Life expectancy estimates for Hadleigh are similar to the Suffolk level, but higher than the England average for both men and women.
- The latest estimate for life expectancy at birth for men in Hadleigh division is 81.9 years, compared to 81.8 in Babergh, 80.9 in Suffolk and 79.8 in England.
- For women, estimated life expectancy at birth for women in Hadleigh is 84; below the Babergh figure of 85.2 but higher than the England average of 83.4.

## DEATHS, UNDER 75 YEARS, STANDARDISED MORTALITY RATIO



- The estimated rate of early deaths from all causes in Hadleigh is below the Babergh, Suffolk and England level.
- The standardised mortality ratio data shown here means that for every 100 early deaths from all causes across England, there are an estimated 87 comparable deaths in Hadleigh.
- The confidence intervals around these estimates are wide due to the small number of deaths at a local level.

## CRIME & COMMUNITY SAFETY



- Hadleigh shows a similar overall rate of crime to Babergh, but significantly below the Suffolk and England averages.
- In the year to the end of January 2021, there were just under 50 recorded crimes per 1,000 residents in Hadleigh compared to 52 in Babergh and 66 across the county as a whole.
- Violence and sexual offences accounted for almost half of recorded crimes in the division during this time.
- The rate of burglaries is slightly higher in Hadleigh than the Suffolk average.
- The rates of crimes have been influenced by the COVID-19 pandemic and related lockdowns.
